

Choice and control policy

Policy statement

Patches promotes and protects individual rights including freedom of expression, self-determination and decision-making.

This policy supports Patches to apply the NDIS Quality and Safeguarding Practice Standards for Rights and Responsibilities, Provider Governance and Operational Management and Provision of Supports.

Scope

This policy applies to all individuals engaged in a service arrangement with Patches.

Principles

- Patches respects the rights of people with disability in exercising choice and control about matters that affect them.
- Collaboration and consultation with people with disability (and other key stakeholders where appropriate) promotes and ensures active choice and control in relation to the services.
- All people with disability are assumed to have capacity to make decisions, exercise choice, and provide informed consent regardless of their disability.
- People are supported to develop their capacity to make independent decisions.
- Timely information is provided in appropriate formats to support informed decision making including people's rights and responsibilities.
- Choice includes smaller decisions about everyday living through to more complex consultation on co-design of service.
- Patches supports people with disability in a way that is appropriate to their circumstances and cultural needs so as to maximise people's opportunities to make choices and have control over decisions that affect their lives.
- Patches recognises the role of family, carers and advocates in representing people's interests and promoting choice and control in the planning and delivery of supports.



Definitions

Dignity of risk – autonomy and self-determination used by a person when making decisions, including the choice to take some risks in life.

Informed consent – voluntary agreement and willing acceptance of a proposition and following action where the person making the decision has appropriate information and capacity to make the decision free or fear or influence.
